

Waste Facility Permit Holders obligations under:

- **European Communities (Shipments of Hazardous Waste exclusively within Ireland) Regulations 2011**
- **Waste Management (Shipments of Waste) Regulations 2007**

Waste moved onto or off the waste permitted site must be transported by an appropriately authorised waste collector and detailed records maintained as per Condition 3.1 of the Waste Facility Permit. Details of authorised waste collectors are available on www.nwcpo.ie

Note: the transportation of non-hazardous waste by persons who are not directly involved with the waste business, at weights less than 2 tonnes, and in vehicles not designed for the carriage of waste, are exempt from requiring a waste collection permit.

Movement of Hazardous Waste within Ireland.

Dublin City Council, National TransFrontier Shipment Office (NTFSO), are the National Competent Authority for the administration and regulation of hazardous waste movements within Ireland. Hazardous waste is waste that is dangerous or potentially harmful to health or the environment. For this reason it is important to manage all hazardous waste safely and to create a traceable record of all hazardous waste movements.

Examples of hazardous waste encountered by Waste Facility Permit holders:

- 16 01 04* - End of Life vehicles.
- 16 06 01* - lead batteries.
- 13 02 06* - synthetic engine, gear and lubricating oils
- 20 01 35* - discarded electrical and electronic equipment.

A Waste Transfer Form (WTF) is a tracking document which must be used whenever hazardous waste is moved within Ireland. WTFs are €6 each and are purchased online using a debit or credit card, after you initially register on-line to create an account. The form is completed online, then printed and signed, and travels with the waste.

Importing and Exporting Waste

The transfrontier shipment of waste deals with the movement of waste between countries.

The NTFSO is the National Competent Authority under the Waste Management (Shipments of Waste) Regulations 2007 for the export, transit and import of waste.

The Regulations cover the following waste:

- (a) exported from the Republic of Ireland to EU Member States
- (b) in transit through the EU
- (c) exported from the Republic of Ireland to countries outside the Community
- (d) imported into the Republic of Ireland from EU Member States
- (e) imported into the Republic of Ireland from countries outside the Community

If you plan to export or import or move hazardous waste through the EU, you must contact the NTFSO prior to the movement of any waste i.e. the procedure of prior written notification and consent.
